One Doctor Says Only the Rich Could

It appears that Chicago physicians do
not believe in the curative properties
of music. Dr. Francis S. Kennedy, of
Brooklyn, has broached the theory, says
the Washington Post. Indeed, he at-
tempted a demonstration not very long
ago and declares that the result was
exceedingly significant. Twenty trained
musicians, playing a variety of instru-
ments, including a brass band, were
employed. The patients, who were
suffering from various ailments, were
placed in a room where the music was
played. The result was that the pa-
tients who were suffering from
nervous diseases, such as hysteria,
and other ailments, were cured. The
theory is that music has a powerful
effect on the human mind, and that
it can be used as a means of curing
disease. The Chicago physicians, how-
ever, do not believe in this theory, and
they do not allow music to be played
in their hospitals.
