For years he was in California hunting elephants, lions and other animals and at one period he was nearly three years without seeing a newspaper, a telegram or any kind of money and he was perfectly happy. He spent nearly a quarter of a century of his life penetrating the interior of South Africa. Then he went to Alaska on a 15,000-mile tour in search of moose and caribou.

One of the most pathetic instances of homelessness in that of which the Mother Indians are said to be the victims. After more than thirty years of waiting the Medoes, who because of their warring upon white settlers in Oregon, were exiled to Indian Territory and placed upon the Quai reservation, are going to be sent back to their native home.

All that time there were 117 of the tribe and today they number only 45. Senator Curtis of Kansas, himself an Indian, in his plea for the return of the remnant of the tribe, gives as his opinion that the mental anxiety brought about by their enforced separation from family and friends is the cause of this rapid decrease in their numbers.—Vogue.
